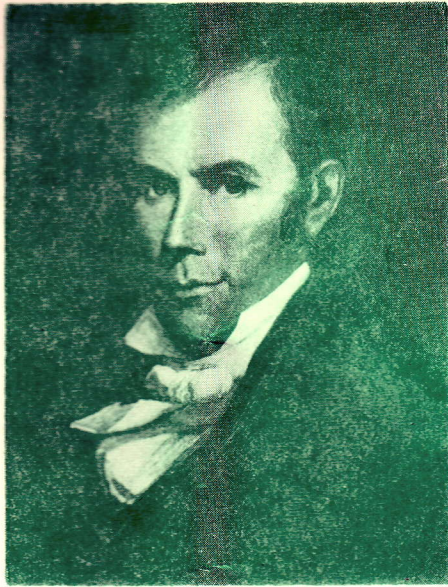

Henry Clay — 1777 - 1852

Henry Clay was a distinguished American statesman, orator and lawyer. Born in Virginia in 1777, he moved to Kentucky at the age of 20 where he engaged in public life for some thirty years until his death in 1852. He served in the Kentucky Legislature and was Speaker of the Lower House, was a member of both the United States House of Representatives and Senate, and was Speaker of the House from 1811 to 1817, was one of the Peace Commissioners at Ghent, Belgium after the war of 1812 and was a candidate for the Presidency. Clay was an advocate of the Missouri Compromise and was largely responsible for the Compromise of 1852. He is said to have been a man of matchless voice, fascinating personality, magnificent bearing, never failing courtesy, agreeable manners and a noble and generous heart. Because of his ability to work out differences between people, he was affectionately known as "The Pacifcator."
